WILL GREGORY MOOG ENSEMBLE

The Will Gregory Moog Ensemble first performed together in 2005 as part of the Bath Festival, recreating some of Wendy Carlos's iconic *Switched-On Bach* arrangements. Fronted by keyboard-player and composer Will Gregory, one-half of the electronic music sensation Goldfrapp and one of the UK's leading advocates of using synthesizers and electronic instruments, the band perform a mixture of specially composed music, transcriptions of classical works, and their own versions of music from popular culture and film scores, to create new sounds and reinvent old ones.

The Will Gregory Moog Ensemble has performed at concerts and electronic music festivals throughout the UK and Europe. The band has appeared with Human League's Martyn Ware at the Elbphilharmonie in Hamburg in 2018, played at the Philharmonie de Paris for the Days Off Festival in July 2019 and were guest artists at the BBC Proms in 2019. The band made several broadcasts for BBC Radio 3, including an enjoyably spooky recording from the Goonhilly Satellite Earth Station.
