BERE

In 2023 Artistic Director Richard Tognetti and the Orchestra delve into new and unexpected sound worlds, intertwining the old with the new, the revered with the undiscovered, as only the ACO can. Featuring seven ambitious national tours that star some of the world's great virtuosos, whilst also championing the talents amongst its own ranks, the ACO's 2023 Season promises to see the Orchestra performing at its brilliant, energising and inimitable best.

Richard Tognetti will continue his exploration of music and film in A Clockwork Orange and Beyond, a collaboration with electronic artist Will Gregory, founding member of English electronica duo Goldfrapp, that celebrates the ground-breaking music of 20th-century composers Wendy Carlos and Delia Derbyshire. Carlos' audacious and wildly original film score for *A Clockwork Orange* makes the film as much hers as Stanley Kubrick's, while Derbyshire gave the iconic *Doctor Who* theme its indelible sci-fi sound. The pair paved the way for the likes of Vangelis, John Williams and Hans Zimmer, the greats behind some of the most affecting and iconic music in cinema.

The 2023 Season opens with Ilya Gringolts Plays Bruch, a concert that marks the return of one of the 21st century's true violin virtuosos, Russian violinist Ilya Gringolts, to perform Bruch's adored Violin Concerto. Egyptian-Australian brothers Joseph and James Tawadros reunite with Richard and the Orchestra for The Four Seasons, a stunning recasting of Vivaldi's masterpiece that will take audiences on an intoxicating adventure through Venice and the Mediterranean. To close the Season, spectacular pianist Polina Leschenko, protégé of the great Martha Argerich, stars alongside Richard Tognetti in Chopin and the Mendelssohns, a dazzling Romantic display of concertos by Chopin, and Felix and Fanny Mendelssohn.





Richard has described performing the sublime symphonies of Mozart as akin to 'dancing on your own joy'. The ACO will celebrate three of the composer's great symphonies, the *Paris*, *Haffner* and *Linz*, in Mozart, an unmissable spectacle featuring period wind and brass players handpicked from across the world and string musicians from the Australian National Academy of Music (ANAM). In Postcards from Italy, the Orchestra pay homage to a country famed for its rich history of music, art and food, while Bohemian Serenades sees the ACO bask in the folk-inspired music of Dvořák and Bartók.

The ACO continues to embrace the music of today's most exciting and innovative composers, with the Season featuring music by the US's Caroline Shaw, the youngest-ever recipient of the Pulitzer Prize, Italy's Giovanni Sollima, and Australian composers Ross Edwards, Holly Harrison and Harry Sdraulig.

The ACO is Australia's most travelled orchestra, both nationally and internationally. In 2023 the Orchestra will embark on two international tours, with planned concerts in North America, Canada, Japan, the UK and Europe. In addition to performing seven national tours in 2023, the ACO will perform at the UKARIA, TarraWarra and Vasse Felix festivals, while ACO Collective will embark on a tour to regional Queensland and New South Wales.

The Orchestra will continue to present concerts and events at its award-winning home, ACO Pier 2/3 in the heart of the Walsh Bay Arts Precinct, with programs announced in early 2023. These include:

- > ACO Up Close, recitals which spotlight the talents of the individual musicians of the Orchestra;
- > ACO Families, engaging, fun-filled concerts designed for young children and their families;
- > ACO Talks, stimulating talks from some of Australia's greatest minds;
- > ACO Relaxed, inclusive and flexible performances tailored to those with access needs.
