### THE AUSTRALIAN CHAMBER ORCHESTRA **REVEALS BLOCKBUSTER 2024 SEASON**

The Australian Chamber Orchestra has announced its blockbuster 2024 Season. An explosive celebration of collaboration, artistry and unparalleled virtuosity, ACO 2024 is a season that showcases the ACO as an orchestra without limits.

From a brand-new collaboration with Sydney Dance Company that basks in the mesmerising music of JS Bach and Arvo Pärt, to the long-awaited national tour of Richard Tognetti and Jennifer Peedom's cinematic and musical odyssey River, and performances featuring international stars including singers Stuart Skelton, Catherine Carby and lestyn Davies, guitarist Sean Shibe and cellist Nicolas Altstaedt, the ACO's 2024 Season is a monumental adventure through extraordinary music.

In 2024 ACO Artistic Director Richard Tognetti reunites with Sydney Dance Company's together music, movement and evocative lighting to create something truly remarkable. Arvo Pärt, two composers whose timeless music speaks to the very core of the human

Rafael Bonachela for an immersive and mesmerising collaboration that will bring Musicians from the ACO, dancers from Sydney Dance Company and Gramophone Award-winning countertenor lestyn Davies come together to celebrate JS Bach and soul. Silence & Rapture promises to be a season highlight: a journey through hope and temptation, tragedy and passion, redemption and, finally, into silence.



The 2024 Season opens with *River*, Richard Tognetti and director Jennifer Peedom's cinematic and musical odyssey that explores how waterways have shaped humanity's very existence. With the film receiving critical acclaim at screenings and major international film festivals in 2022, and soundtrack wins at the ARIA and AACTA awards, the long-anticipated live concert version of *River* weaves captivating cinematography with enthralling music, from JS Bach to Jonny Greenwood, William Barton and Tognetti himself, performed live by the ACO and Barton. The result is awe-inspiring, powerful and utterly captivating.

Guitarist **Sean Shibe**, one of the most electrifying musicians on the planet, makes his Australian debut in *Scotland Unbound*. A perfect match for the infectious energy for which the ACO is famed around the globe, Shibe is a chameleon of the new generation. In his ACO debut, he performs a virtuosic program, across electric and acoustic instruments, that celebrates his Scottish heritage, from Julia Wolfe's frenetic *Lad* to the world premiere of a new commission by **Cassandra Miller**, a soul-stirring composer whose hypnotic music 'reminds us how to cry' (*The New Yorker*).

Joining Tognetti and the ACO in *Mahler's Song of the Earth* are Australian singers **Stuart Skelton**, one of the great heldentenors tenors of our time, and celebrated mezzo-soprano **Catherine Carby**. This is a rare chance to hear Skelton and Carby on their home stage, singing some of the most demanding music ever written for the human voice in Mahler's *Das Lied von der Erde*. This is music that unflinchingly delves into our deepest selves, from darkness, light, cruelty, love, beauty and at last, catharsis.

Sparks will fly in *Tognetti. Mendelssohn. Bach.*, a concert that sees Richard Tognetti return to the altar of JS Bach. Bach sought God in his music and has in turn become a god-like figure for musicians, a touchstone to which all other music is compared. Tognetti's recordings of Bach's music are ARIA-award winning, and hearing him perform the composer's Violin Concerto in A promises to be an electrifying experience. Also on the program is Mendelssohn's sunny Octet, alongside a new commission from trailblazing young Australian composer Jakub Jankowski and music from Icelandic composer Anna Thorvaldsdottir.

In 2023 Australia voted the cello as the country's favourite instrument in the ABC Classic 100 Instrument Countdown. In 2024 audiences will have the opportunity to experience a true master of the instrument, world-renowned cellist **Nicolas Altstaedt**, who will make his ACO debut with Haydn's beloved Cello Concerto in C major and Tchaikovsky's *Rococo Variations* in *Altstaedt Plays Haydn & Tchaikovsky*. It's been more than a decade since the young cellist burst onto the world stage as a BBC New Generation Artist, with his unruly curls, unorthodox concert attire and pure talent, and since then, he's piled up musical accolades from the stages of New York, London and beyond.

2024 will also see the return of star pianist **Kristian Bezuidenhout**, a longtime friend of the ACO, in *Beethoven's Emperor*. Bezuidenhout has a special affinity for historical instruments and this concert will see him direct the Orchestra from the fortepiano in a joyful celebration of one of Ludwig van Beethoven's most beloved works, the *Emperor Piano Concerto*.



#### JENNIFER PEEDOM DIRECTOR & WRITER *River*

Jennifer Peedom is a BAFTA-nominated director, known for her gripping, intimate portraits of people in extreme circumstances. Her credits include *Living the End, Solo, Sherpa, Mountain* and *River*.

Jennifer's films have played at multiple A-list international festivals, winning awards including the Grierson Award for Best Documentary at the BFI London Film Festival, an AFI Award, and a BAFTA nomination. Her film *Mountain*, created in collaboration with the ACO, became the highest grossing Australian documentary of all time.



KRISTIAN BEZUIDENHOUT FORTEPIANO & GUEST DIRECTOR Beethoven's Emperor

Kristian Bezuidenhout is one of today's most notable and versatile keyboard artists. Born in South Africa, he spent much of his youth in Australia where he fell in love with keyboard instruments at an early age, leading to a move to New York to study at the Eastman School of Music. He is as at home playing on early-19th -century style fortepianos and harpsichords as he is on modern instruments, describing the former as giving the music of Mozart, Beethoven and other classical composers 'a completely different character; instead of restraint, there's a wonderful feeling of letting go'. #### WILLIAM BARTON DIDGERIDOO, VOCALS & COMPOSER *River*

William Barton is a composer, producer, multi-instrumentalist and vocalist.

For two decades, William has forged a peerless profile as a performer and composer in the classical music world, from performing with the Philharmonic Orchestras of London and Berlin to marking historic events at Westminster Abbey and Anzac Cove. With his prodigious musicality and the quiet conviction of his Kalkadunga heritage, he has vastly expanded the horizons of the didgeridoo and the culture and landscape that it represents. #### STUART SKELTON TENOR Mahler's Song of the Earth

Grammy-nominated Australian vocalist Stuart Skelton is one of the world's great heldentenors ('heroic tenors'), critically acclaimed for his outstanding musicianship, tonal beauty and intensely dramatic portrayals. He is in constant demand on concert stages around the world and has appeared with all the great orchestras and opera houses, including the Metropolitan Opera and The Royal Opera, Covent Garden. He is famed internationally for his interpretations of the notoriously demanding music of Wagner and Mahler.



#### **CATHERINE CARBY** MEZZO-SOPRANO Mahler's Song of the Earth

Rafael Bonachela is a choreographer, artistic director and curator whose career has seen him successfully span high art and popular culture, working across a range of art forms, including contemporary dance, art installations, pop concerts, musicals, film, commercials and fashion. He has been Artistic Director of Sydney Dance Company since 2009.




