# CLUB WELD ARTISTS



### **Adoni**

Adoni combines his love of animation and obscure TV and radio monologues to create spoken word collages as synth pop singles. His signature vocal style creates sonic worlds that are at once sinister and playful.



#### **Charbel Nehme**

Charbel Nehme writes his emotional experiences into a pop sound inspired by icons like Madonna, Kylie and Tina. In contrast, Nehme's 'star persona' balances dedication to a catchy chorus, with lyrics about grief, personal pride and love for family.



# **Jerrah Patston**

Jerrah Patston writes and sings disarming country and folk songs with anthemic pop choruses. Patston has a deft ability to channel his ordinary-extraordinary world observations into songs packed with harmonies and hooks.



## **Jonathan Yung**

Jonathan Yung effortlessly writes and performs keyboard-based compositions including cinematic piano and synthesizer instrumentals as well as irresistible pop, disco, tango and dancehall tunes with intricate melodies and the occasional charming vocal.



# **Melanie Eden (Moo)**

Melanie Eden (Moo) is an experimental vocalist-songwriter and accordionist. As a dhamma practitioner she creates for the ending of greed, hate and delusion. Eden's experience of violence and its impact, as well as neurodiversity, mean advocacy is central to her work.



### **Nina Gotsis**

Nina Gotsis writes expressionistic new folk inspired by the natural world, a lyric vision incorporating the Pacific Ocean, bird life and country. Gotsis' exquisite and succinct songs are mantras for the present and our future.



#### **Patrick Li**

Patrick Li writes neo-classical piano works and charming baroque pop at a pace. Armed with impressive compositional skills, Li's idiosyncratic, often cheeky compositions are fuelled by excellent technique, photographic memory and synaesthesia.



# Sienna Acquaro

Sienna Acquaro writes and sings emotional piano compositions infused with pop, jazz and classical influences. Acquaro's work bravely presents darker aspects of the human condition where beauty and pain are experienced in the same moment.



### **Tua Hunt**

Tua Hunt is a singer-songwriter, arranger and classically trained pianist who grew up listening to jazz, classical, gospel, Motown, and funk music. A specialist in three and fourpart harmonies, Hunt sets philosophical lyrics within an irresistible soul-jazz sound.

Arts & Cultural Exchange (ACE) is a cultural organisation on Dharug Country in Western Sydney which for more than 40 years has employed art, creativity and culture to reverse disadvantage experienced by historically underrepresented communities. Renowned for its commitment to excellence and to social justice, ACE works across five program areas: First Nations, Youth Engagement, Multicultural Women, Screen, and Artists with Disability. Since 2015 the Club Weld program for talented neurodiverse musicians has been the heart of ACE's work with Artists with Disability.

Club Weld's ambition is for the success of neurodiverse musicians as they pursue music, develop careers and are recognised as professionals. The program supports musicians with music making, recording and distribution projects, as well as professional development initiatives including performances, touring and high-profile creative partnerships.

Club Weld artists have undertaken residencies at the Sydney Opera House (2017), the Art Gallery of New South Wales (2018 & 2019) and, currently, Museum of Old and New Art in Tasmania. Between them, the musicians' work has been featured in an impressive range of high-profile contexts, including ABC TV's Rage, 'synched' for the television series 'Bump', the theme song for ABC TV's animated series 'Fizzy and Suds', and a collaboration with Parramatta's philharmonic choir, River City Voices.





# ABOUT THE ACO

The Australian Chamber Orchestra lives and breathes music, making waves around the world for its explosive performances that redefine orchestral music. With its fearless leader of 35 years, Artistic Director Richard Tognetti, in 2025 the Orchestra celebrates 50 years of invention, disruption and unforgettable music-making.

The ACO performs more than 100 concerts each year, with programs that

embrace celebrated classics alongside new commissions and ground-breaking collaborations, working with artists and musicians who share the Orchestra's ideology: from Emmanuel Pahud, Steven Isserlis, Patricia Kopatchinskaja, Pekka Kuusisto, Nicolas Altstaedt and William Barton, to Jonny Greenwood, Neil Finn and Meow Meow; to visual artists and film makers such as Bill Henson, Shaun Tan, Jane Campion, and Jennifer Peedom, who co-create unique, hybrid productions for which the ACO has become renowned.

The ACO has its own streaming platform, ACO On Demand, which hosts the Orchestra's award-winning cinematic concert films, ACO StudioCasts, alongside live concert streams. The Orchestra also has an active recording program, with Richard Tognetti and the Orchestra winning eight ARIA Awards. Recent releases include Water /Night Music, the first Australian-produced classical vinyl for two decades, Tchaikovsky /Shostakovich and ARIA award-winning albums River and Indies & Idols.

In 2022 the ACO opened a new, worldclass venue, ACO On The Pier, continuing the Orchestra's dedication to creating and presenting transformative experiences for all music lovers.
