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Rivers live in deep time, tumbling through millennia. They give us so much more than water. They course through our imaginations; renew our spirits. With quiet determination, they overcome the hardest and strongest things. They run into the future – and they remember the past, painting their way across landscapes.

From Richard Tognetti, Musical Director

River has been conceived as both a live performance experience and a theatrical film. You can turn existing films into bespoke concerts, but actually making a film like that, with the intention that it will be performed live, is a rare, if not unique, occurrence in the world of film and concert making.

Creating the score for a film that will be performed live presents its own challenges. There are specific restrictions that must be adhered to, primarily how many musicians are involved in the live performance. However I don't mind restrictions; I actually find them liberating. When you've just got strings and electronics to work with, instead of say a full orchestra, you're forced to be original. The challenge makes you think differently.

The score includes Jonny Greenwood's *Water*, an exquisite, intricate piece, based on a poem, that presented an ideal match to footage of the funeral pyres on the edge of the Ganges in India. I'm also delighted that we were able to include JS Bach's *Chaconne*, in a new arrangement for string orchestra. Based on a four-bar motif, it starts small and then grows into something that is overwhelmingly epic in form and texture, much like a river. That's the genius of Bach.

From Jennifer Peedom, Writer and Director River

Humans love rivers. The number of films, books, and poems with 'river' in their titles are impossible to count. And yet, the state of rivers around the world indicates that we seem to have lost sight of their importance to our existence.

River takes a birds'-eye view of humanity's relationship with our most precious resource through time. It is a story about the limits of human control, and how our short-sighted attempts to control nature have backfired.

We hope the film prompts the audience to believe that encounters with nature can permanently shift, for the better, the way we think about the environment and how our decisions impact the environment.

Richard Tognetti

Richard Tognetti is Artistic Director of the Australian Chamber Orchestra. He has established an international reputation for his compelling performances and artistic individualism.

Richard began his studies in his home town of Wollongong with William Primrose, then with Alice Waten at the Sydney Conservatorium, and Igor Ozim at the Bern Conservatory, where he was awarded the Tschumi Prize as the top graduate soloist in 1989. Later that year he led several performances of the Australian Chamber Orchestra, and that November was appointed as the Orchestra's lead violin and, subsequently, Artistic Director.

Richard performs on period, modern and electric instruments and his numerous arrangements, compositions and transcriptions have expanded the chamber orchestra repertoire and been performed throughout the world. As director or soloist, he has appeared with the Orchestra of the Age of Enlightenment, the Academy of Ancient Music, Slovene Philharmonic Orchestra, Handel & Haydn Society (Boston), Hong Kong Philharmonic, Camerata Salzburg, Tapiola Sinfonietta, Irish Chamber Orchestra, Orchestre Philharmonique du Luxembourg, Nordic Chamber Orchestra and all the major Australian symphony orchestras, most recently as soloist and director with the Melbourne and Tasmanian Symphony Orchestras. Richard also performed the Barbican Centre's first Artist-in-Residence at Milton Court Concert Hall in London in 2016. Richard created the Huntington Festival in Mudgee, New South Wales and was Artistic Director of the Festival Maribor in Slovenia from 2008 to 2015.

Richard was the co-composer of the score for Peter Weir's *Master and Commander: The Far Side of the World*, starring Russell Crowe; he co-composed the soundtrack to Tom Carroll's surf film *Storm Surfers*; and created *The Red Tree*, inspired by Shaun Tan's book. He also created the documentary film *Musica Surfica*, as well as *The Glide, The Reef* and *The Crowd*. Richard collaborated with Director Jennifer Peedom and Stranger Than Fiction Films to create the film *Mountain* for the ACO, which went on to become the highest-grossing homegrown documentary in Australian cinemas ever following its release.

Richard was appointed an Officer of the Order of Australia in 2010. He holds honorary doctorates from three Australian universities and was made a National Living Treasure in 1999. He performs on the 1743 'Carrodus' Guarneri del Gesù violin, lent to him by an anonymous Australian private benefactor.

The Australian Chamber Orchestra lives and breathes music, making waves around the world for its explosive performances and brave interpretations. 
Led by Artistic Director Richard Tognetti since 1990, the ACO performs more than 100 concerts each year. Whether performing in Manhattan, New York, or Wollongong, NSW, the ACO is unwavering in its commitment to creating transformative musical experiences.

The Orchestra regularly collaborates with artists and musicians who share its ideology: from Emmanuel Pahud, Steven Isserlis, Dawn Upshaw, Olli Mustonen, Brett Dean and Ivry Gitlis, to Neil Finn, Jonny Greenwood, Barry Humphries and Meow Meow; to visual artists and film makers such as Michael Leunig, Bill Henson, Shaun Tan, Jon Frank and Jennifer Peedom, who have co-created unique, hybrid productions for which the ACO has become renowned.

Testament to its international reputation, the ACO was appointed as the first ever International Associate Ensemble at Milton Court in partnership with London's Barbican Centre from 2018 to 2020. This residency at one of Europe's most prestigious concert venues followed on from the success of ACO Artistic Director Richard Tognetti's time as the Barbican's inaugural Artist-in-Residence at Milton Court Concert Hall.

In addition to its national and international touring schedule, the Orchestra has an active recording program across CD, vinyl and digital formats. Recent releases include *Water | Night Music*, the first Australian-produced classical vinyl for two decades; *Brahms Symphonies 3 & 4; Mozart's Last Symphonies*; and the soundtrack to the acclaimed cinematic collaboration, *Mountain*.

In 2020 the ACO launched ACO StudioCasts, a digital subscription season that features a series of cinematic and immersive concert films.
