The ACO opens 2024 Season with awe-inspiring cinematic odyssey River

The Australian Chamber Orchestra will open its 2024 Season with AACTA and ARIA award-winning cinematic production, River, Artistic Director Richard Tognetti's collaboration with director Jennifer Peedom, writer Robert Macfarlane and actor Willem Dafoe.

The sequel to the record-breaking Mountain, River is a profound cinematic and musical ode to rivers that explores how the planet's natural waterways have shaped landscapes, communities and humanity's very existence. Featuring footage captured by some of the world's great cinematographers from 39 countries across the globe, from India's Ganges to the UK's Thames and Australia's own Murray-Darling, River is an awe-inspiring homage to these 'arteries of the planet'.

Peedom says, "Humans love rivers. The number of films, books, and poems with "river" in their titles are impossible to count. And yet, the state of rivers around the world indicates that we seem to have lost sight of their importance to our existence. River takes a birds'-eye view of humanity's relationship with our most precious resource through time."

At the forefront of the film is a spectacular score curated by Tognetti, featuring music by composers and musicians including Bach, Ravel, Jonny Greenwood, Radiohead and Tognetti himself. This will be performed live by the ACO, alongside a screening of the film, making the astonishing impact of River even more powerful.

"River has been conceived as both a live performance experience and a theatrical film," Tognetti explains. "You can turn existing films into bespoke concerts, but actually making a film like that, with the intention that it will be performed live, is a rare, if not unique, occurrence in the world of film and concert making. Creating the score for a film that will be performed live presents its own challenges and restrictions. However, I don't mind restrictions; I actually find them liberating. The challenge makes you think differently."

Joining the ACO onstage for these performances is Indigenous Australian didgeridoo virtuoso and vocalist William Barton, who, together with co-composers Tognetti and Piers Burbrook de Vere, contributed music to the River score, including the breathtaking improvisational track Spirit Voice of the Enchanted Waters. A regular ACO collaborator, Barton describes drawing upon his Kalkadunga heritage during the improvised performance, saying, "I was connecting to my ancestral ties, to the mother country, to my experiences of going out bush as a young kid on Kalkadunga country and seeing the little water holes out there connected to emu dreaming, and to the significance of songlines."

Following acclaimed screenings of the film in theatres and film festivals across the globe, the ACO's performance of River in London's Barbican Centre in October 2022 was met with a rapturous standing ovation.

The ACO is famed around the world for its unique, cross-artform productions. In addition to River, these include surf films Musica Surfica and The Reef and boundary-pushing collaborations Mountain, Luminous and The Crowd & I.
