## The concepts of music

**Tempo**: Tempo is a description of the speed of the beat or notes. Click here to learn more about tempo.

**Duration:** Duration refers to how long a note lasts for. Click here to learn about the longest piece ever composed. It takes 639 years to perform the entire piece, and it is currently only 19 years in!

**Articulation:** Articulation describes how notes connect to each other - it could be smooth and connected or short and separated. Click here to revisit this video, created by some of the ACO Musicians from Lesson 5 to learn more about string articulations.

**Texture:** Texture refers to how many 'layers' there are in a piece of music. Click here to learn more about musical texture.

**Dynamics:** Dynamics is the word used to describe the volume of a piece - how loud or soft it is. In the video lesson, Sharon explained that most musicians refer to a set of Italian words to describe dynamics in music. See them below a list of some of the common Italian terms.

| TERM        | EFFECT                   |
|-------------|--------------------------|
| Pianissimo  | Very soft                |
| Piano       | Soft                     |
| Mezzo piano | Moderately / medium soft |
| Mezzo forte | Moderately / medium loud |
| Forte       | Loud                     |
| Fortissimo  | Very loud                |
| Fortepiano  | Loud then soft           |
| Sforzando   | Sudden accent            |
| Crescendo   | Gradually getting louder |
| Diminuendo  | Gradually getting softer |
