

Superstar pianist Alexander Gavrylyuk makes ACO debut

National Tour

ACO Artistic Director Richard Tognetti will direct the Australian **Chamber Orchestra** in a national tour that celebrates the unifying power of music, featuring superstar Ukrainian-Australian pianist Alexander Gavrylyuk in his long-awaited ACO debut.

Born in Kharkiv, Ukraine, Gavrylyuk began learning the piano at the age of seven before giving his first concerto performance at nine. After moving to Australia at 13, he rose to international fame upon winning First Prize and Gold Medal at the Horowitz International Piano Competition while still a teenager. He went on to win multiple prestigious piano competitions around the globe including First Prize at the Hamamatsu International Piano Competition and Gold Medal at the Arthur Rubinstein International Piano Masters Competition and regularly performs as soloist with the likes of the Royal Concertgebouw Orchestra and the New York Philharmonic.

Gavrylyuk will join the ACO to perform music including **Shostakovich's** fiendishly virtuosic and jazz-infused Piano Concerto No.1 and Gershwin's Rhapsody in Blue, a life-affirming and exultant celebration of difference and dynamism. It stands in stark contrast to Shostakovich's intense and emotional **Chamber Symphony**, an arrangement of his Eighth String

Quartet that the ACO has performed internationally to critical acclaim, most recently at London's Barbican Centre with *The Guardian UK* describing the performance as 'revelatory' in a 5-star review. Written during his stay in post-war Dresden, Shostakovich dedicated the work to "the victims of fascism and war". The music tells a story of fear and melancholy but never loses hope.

The ACO will also perform the **world premiere** of *A Moment of Memory*, a new commission from **Valentin Silvestrov**, Ukraine's most celebrated living composer. Written by the composer in Berlin after fleeing his home in Kyiv, Silvestrov's music is revered for its bittersweet, introspective lyricism, with the composer describing it as "a response to and an echo of what already exists."

Gavrylyuk says: "Not many things in this world can unite people, but I think that music comes the furthest in revealing that perhaps on a deeper level we are all quite similar. When the audience reacts in one wave of emotion that to me is the most incredible and inspiring thing."
