

Journey to Italy with the ACO and instruments of the Italian Golden Age

POSTCARDS FROM ITALY

14-26 September

From its food and wine to its art, architecture and, of course, music, Italy has long been a destination for inspiration, indulgence and pure enjoyment.

The Australian Chamber Orchestra will present a musical love letter to Italy, a country that has cultivated and inspired generations of musicians and artists, in *Postcards from Italy*, touring nationally from 14–26 September.

An intimate ensemble of six ACO musicians will perform music inspired by Italy, from **JS Bach**'s popular *Italian Concerto*, which reveals the composer's lasting fascination with the country's musical innovations, to the great Tuscan cello virtuoso and composer **Boccherini**, whose String Quintet in C minor embodies the country's elegance and grace. Also on the program is **Tchaikovsky**'s beloved *Souvenir de Florence*, written while the composer was on holiday in Florence, while *Viaggio in Italia*, by the great Italian cellist and composer **Giovanni Sollima**, is a musical embodiment of the great luminaires in Italian art, music and literature.

In a fitting touch to the program, the ACO musicians will perform on precious Italian Golden Age string instruments crafted by famed luthiers including **Antonio Stradivari, Giuseppe Guarneri filius Andreæ** and **the Brothers Amati**. A period lasting from the 17th century to the middle 18th century in Cremona, the Golden Age is regarded as the pinnacle of fine string instrument making, with instruments from this period prized around the world for their tonal excellence, design, and beauty. In the hands of the ACO musicians, these extraordinary instruments become living pieces of history, bringing to life music from across the centuries.

These Golden Age instruments played by the ACO include the 'ex-Dollfus' violin made in 1732 by Antonio Stradivari (played by ACO Principal Violin **Helena Rathbone**), a cello made in 1729 by Giuseppe Guarneri (played by ACO Cello **Julian Thompson**) and a cello made in 1616 by the Brothers Amati (played by ACO Principal Cello **Timo-Veikko Valve**).
